Your tasks as a volunteer

- Participate in building and renovating homes, schools, and community spaces.
- Help enhance educational facilities by constructing classrooms and playgrounds.
- Assist with the painting and refurbishment of cultural sites such as churches and convents.
- Prepare and transport construction materials, dig foundations, and lay bricks.
- Engage in woodworking tasks, including furniture repair and crafting.
- Collaborate with local residents to identify needs and provide tailored solutions.

Schedule

Monday to Friday

- **Morning:** Begin your day with a hearty breakfast before heading to the project site. Receive a briefing from the coordinator outlining your tasks for the day.
- **Midday:** Take a break for lunch at a nearby facility or on-site, re-energizing for the afternoon's work.
- **Afternoon:** Continue with construction or renovation activities, focusing on tasks like building, painting, plastering, or repairing furniture. Work approximately 4–5 hours each day.
- **Evening:** Return to your accommodation, unwind over dinner, and reflect on the day's progress.

This schedule can be changed and/or amended depending on weather conditions, local conditions and unforeseen circumstances.

Accommodation

Our accommodations include four units, each with three spacious bedrooms and comfortable double beds. Each room can accommodate **two to eight people**, depending on the size of the room. We also have private rooms with dedicated bathrooms. Each room has its own bathroom and toilet.

Meals

3 meals on weekdays, 2 on weekends. The food provided will primarily consist of Kenyan cuisine. This cuisine is primarily composed of a variety of vegetables, potatoes, eggs, bread, and pancakes commonly referred to as "chapati," as well as an assortment of fruits such as oranges, bananas, and avocados.

Mandatory Orientation Day

You will attend our orientation day **on Monday of your first week** at this location to become acquainted with the surroundings as well as the local culture. Your program will continue as usual from Tuesday onward throughout the rest of the week.

Sights & Surroundings

- The Great Rift Valley: It is an unforgettably scenic area, featuring hot springs, geysers, and lakes, as well as volcanoes, some of which are still active.
- Lake Nakuru National Park: is one of the best national parks in Kenya. You will
 enjoy a wide variety of wildlife species, especially the flamingos, which make the lake
 look pink.
- Menengai Crater
- **Aberdare National Park:** The park is mainly a habitat for elephants, black rhinos, leopards, and other wild animals.
- **Baboon Cliff View Point:** It is the most popular view point in Lake Nakuru National Park. It gets its name from the baboons that are common around that cliff
- Lake Bogoria: The entire lake is surrounded by dwarf trees and grass, where you can find zebras, duikers, hyraxes, and many other wild animals.
