

# **Teen Summer Camp in Bali**

- Day 5: Sea Turtle Conservation Project + visit to Crystal Bay Beach

- Day 7: Sea Turtle Conservation Project + Campfire
- Day 8: Sea Turtle Conservation Project
- Day 9: Excursion to the island of Nusa Lembongan + Bike tour to explore the island + Visit to the mangrove forest
- Day 10: Snorkelling excursion
- Day 11: Sea Turtle Conservation Project
- Day 12: Sea Turtle Conservation Project
- Day 13: Sea Turtle Conservation Project
- Day 14: Private transfer to the airport for your return flight.

# The Project:

The sea turtle conservation programme is located on the charming island of Nusa Penida, around 45 minutes by boat from Bali. You will be helping to protect the turtle population by working in our turtle conservation centre, which welcomes many volunteer travellers as part of a sustainable tourism initiative.

The project was set up 13 years ago to take in injured turtles and recover their eggs so that they could hatch in good conditions. Some hatchlings are then released, while others are kept for a while to grow up and increase their chances of survival. Depending on the time of year (turtles don't lay eggs all year round), you can help to identify turtle species, collect eggs, monitor nests or accompany baby turtles to the sea in safety.

This programme gives you the chance to participate in sustainable development in comfortable conditions with the beach practically on your doorstep.

## **Detailed itinerary:**

Day 1 (Fri): Arrival at airport and transfer to accommodation

Day 2 (Sat): In the morning, we will have an introduction with general information as well as Balinese culture. As an introduction to the project, we will visit the marine conservation centre in the afternoon. In the evening, we will watch a documentary on marine turtle conservation.

Day 3 (Sun): In the morning, we'll head to Broken Tooth beach renowned for its remarkable geological formation with a large natural arch cut into the limestone cliff, creating an inner pool of water. The location is impressive for its panoramic views of the sea and surrounding cliffs. We'll also visit Angel's Billabong, a famous natural rock pool formed by the erosion of limestone rock. Seawater collects in the basin at low tide, creating a natural pool of crystal-clear water. We then head to the very popular Kelingking Point, the most photographed spot on Nusa Penida. In the evening, we'll leave the group to enjoy some rest. Day 4 (Mon): We'll spend the whole day at the sea turtle conservation centre to take part in the project. Throughout the week, we'll have a variety of tasks to carry out, including cleaning the tanks, feeding the turtles, making awareness-raising signs and cleaning the beach.

Day 5 (Tue): In the morning, we will visit the conservation centre. In the afternoon, we'll visit Crystal Bay beach. Renowned for its crystal-clear water, it is ideal for snorkelling and scuba diving due to its impressive marine biodiversity.

Day 6 (Sea): Third project day at the sea turtle conservation centre.

Day 7 (Thu): Fourth project day at the sea turtle conservation centre. In the evening, we take part in a campfire.

Day 8 (Fri): Conditions permitting, we will start this day by releasing the turtles back into the sea and then continue our project in the afternoon.

Day 9 (Sat): In the morning we'll set off on an excursion to the island of Nusa Lembongan. This is a small island to the south-east of Bali, popular for its beautiful beaches, crystal-clear waters and diverse marine life. In the afternoon, we'll continue exploring this island by bike. We will also have the chance to see a mangrove forest Mangroves play a crucial role as a coastal ecosystem, providing a vital habitat for including fish, crabs, birds and other animals.

Day 10 (Sun): We set off for an all-day snorkelling excursion. Bali offers many exciting snorkelling opportunities due to its crystal clear waters, colourful coral reefs and diverse marine life.

Day 11 (Mon): To start this new week, we'll head back to the sea turtle conservation centre to continue our project. an introduction to the sea turtle conservation programme and then

we'll begin our project. In the afternoon, we'll leave some free time for the group to relax on the beach.

Day 12 (Tue): Seventh day at the turtle conservation centre and rest on the beach.

Day 13 (Wed): Last day at the turtle conservation centre.

Day 14 (Thu): Private transfer to the airport to catch your return flight.
